Birth Pains (Luke 1:26-33)

- Note... Mary and Joseph had <u>plans</u>.
- Being all in the family means you have a birth pain story.
- "A whole new generation of Christians has come up believing that it is possible to 'accept' Christ without <u>forsaking</u> the world." A.W. Tozer
- Question: What won't you give up and have rationalized God is "okay with?"

Q & A & Q (Luke 2:41-52)

- Note... it took Mary and Joseph three days.
- Being all in the family means you have a <u>boundary</u> to overcome.
- "What crowds our view is the Enemy's skill at cropping photos." Louie Giglio
- Question: When you assume Jesus is missing, where <u>aren't</u> you actually looking for Him? Why?

Persistent Whining (John 2:1-5)

- Note... Mary had a personal <u>faith</u> in Jesus.
- Being all in the family means you have a <u>reset</u> in identity.
- "Faith is not the belief that God will do what you want. It is the belief that God will do what is right." Max Lucado
- Question: As you name the next miracle you want Jesus to do, how is He in turn, naming you?

By the way...

- Jesus grew up in a big <u>blended</u> family. (<u>Mark 6:3</u>)
- His brothers <u>didn't believe</u> in Him. (<u>John 7:5</u>)
- Jesus never sinned, which means He <u>honored</u> His family perfectly. (<u>1 Peter</u> 2:22, <u>Exodus</u> 20:12)

Thicker Than Blood (Mark 3:20-35)

- Note... Mary and her kids were concerned.
- Being all in the family means you trade <u>precedent</u> for <u>purpose</u>.
- "What Jesus does with His statement is demonstrate that as important as
 His earthly relatives are to Him, they have no special <u>claim</u> on Him..." R.C.
 Sproul
- Question: When you have to choose between keeping your family <u>happy</u> versus <u>followina</u> Jesus, what will happen?

Cross Paths (John 19:26-27)

- Note... Mary was important to Jesus.
- Being all in the family means you take care of real needs.
- "If anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for his immediate family, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever." (1 Timothy 5:8)
- Question: How is God calling you to <u>serve</u>?
