Today we're going to explore an astonishing conversation Jesus had in the most unlikely, under the most unlikely circumstances, with the most unlikely who was at the lowest possible end of the social, cultural, intellectual, and economic scale of that time.
1. Jesus Breaks DownConstructed Obstacles

#### **MESSAGE NOTES**

What did Jesus have to say to ordinary people like you and me? What did <u>He do</u> in people's lives?

Today we're going to explore an astonishing conversation Jesus had in the most unlikely <u>place</u>, under the most unlikely circumstances, with the most unlikely <u>person</u> who was at the lowest possible end of the social, cultural, intellectual, and economic scale of that time.

### 1. Jesus Breaks Down Human-Constructed Obstacles

Note John 4:4-9

Just by travelling through Samaria, Jesus was <u>shattering</u> age-old, humanly constructed barriers.

Human barriers and obstacles do not hinder Jesus from reaching out to us.

### 2. Jesus Breaks Down Spiritual Barriers

A. He <u>patiently</u> reveals truth—Jesus was hot, tired, and thirsty, but His request for a drink (note <u>John 4:7</u>) was for a <u>higher</u> purpose (note <u>John 4:9-10</u>). The <u>issue</u> was no longer Jesus' physical thirst, but this woman's spiritual need. Jesus offered *living water* to this individual's <u>parched</u> soul. Note <u>John 4:11-15</u>. Note <u>1 Corinthians 2:14</u>. God's love for us is a <u>patient</u> love.

- B. He gently <u>confronts</u> us—the Bible describes this universally acknowledged human condition by a little 3-letter word: <u>Sin</u>. In a gentle, yet profound way, Jesus <u>dealt</u> with this individual's sin (note <u>John 4:16-19</u>). He knows the <u>baggage</u> we carry around. He has an answer, a <u>remedy</u> for us, but He needs us to honestly acknowledge our sin and our need.
- C. He gets to the <a href="heart">heart</a> of the matter—(note <a href="John 4:20-21">John 4:20-21</a>) the <a href="where">where</a> of worship isn't the issue...It's <a href="when">when</a>, <a href="when">who</a>, <a href="when">and how</a> that matters (note <a href="John 4:22-24">John 4:22-24</a>). It comes from the <a href="inside-out...</a>...true worshippers are the result of the <a href="love">love</a> of God and the <a href="truth">truth</a> of God transforming the human heart. True worshippers are people who have had a <a href="spiritual heart transplant">spiritual heart transplant</a>. The heart of the matter for the woman at the well (and for you and me today) is what are we going to do <a href="with Jesus">with Jesus</a> (note <a href="John 4:25-26">John 4:25-26</a>). Amazingly, the first time Jesus <a href="publicly">publicly</a> disclosed who He was...was to this obscure, problem-laden woman in hated Samaria.
