### **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

Icebreaker: January 31st marks the 42nd day of winter with a mere 48 days until spring (yes, this does mean we are not yet at the halfway mark). What do you plan to do with the remaining 7 weeks of winter bliss?

- **1.** Pastor Nate encouraged us that, "Faith doesn't look like hesitant handwringing that is hoping for God to maybe one day act. (It's)...seeing Jesus for all He is and approaching Him with boldness." When have you or someone you know displayed "hesitant handwringing" or "approaching him with boldness" and what was the outcome?
- **2.** As you read the account in <u>Matthew 8:5-10</u>, discuss how the Roman officer displayed bold faith by releasing his own authority and recognizing Jesus'. Why is releasing our own authority and recognizing Jesus' necessary to demonstrate bold faith?
- **3.** Pastor Nate listed two preconceived notions in the Message Notes. How does pushing through these help us reach Jesus? (See <u>2 Peter 3:9</u>, <u>John 3:16-17</u> and <u>1 Corinthians 2:9, 16.</u>)
- **4.** How will boldly sharing your story with Jesus and allowing Him to do the writing look for you this week? What preconceived notions do you need to push through to enable this to happen?

As Jesus interacted with people, He rarely met their <u>expectations</u> and often <u>reversed</u> their understanding.

Jesus produces <u>astonishina</u> faith (<u>Matthew 8:5-10</u>)

- Faith doesn't look like <u>hesitant</u> handwringing that is hoping for God to <u>maybe</u> one day act.
- Instead, it looks like seeing Jesus for <u>all</u> He is and approaching Him with boldness, pursuing <u>His</u> agenda for our lives. (<u>Matthew 8:5-6a, 8-9a</u>)

Jesus' welcome is astonishing.

- Jesus welcomes <u>anyone</u>. (2 <u>Peter 3:9</u>)
- Jesus welcomes the <u>release</u> of our authority and <u>recognition</u> of His.
   (<u>Matthew 8:5-8</u>)
