### **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

Icebreaker: What one skill or talent would you like to get better at, and, if given the chance to be a "professional" at this skill, would you choose to do so?

- 1. What encouraged or challenged you in your reading this week (*Wait 2.3 "Faith Tested" 2.5*)?
- 2. Waiting in the dark is "really hard", Pastor Tom explained, "because we don't always know what the timeline is." Read <u>Habakkuk 2:3</u>. How can we be confident in the waiting despite not knowing our timeline?
- **3**. Pastor Tom indicated, "When God pushes 'pause' in our lives, it is always to accomplish His purposes." Describe a time you experienced this truth.
- **4.** Read <u>Habakkuk 2:3, John 2:4</u>; <u>7:30</u> and <u>Revelation 1:9</u>. How did Habakkuk, Jesus, Paul and John experience the "pauses" of God's timeline in their lives?
- 5. Have you ever tried to force or stop God's "unstoppable timing?" What was the outcome?
- **6.** Read the 5 woes found in <u>Habakkuk 2</u> (verses 6b, 9, 12, 15 and 19). How does knowing God has the last word and will accomplish His plans influence our response to being in God's waiting room?
- 7. Read <u>Habakkuk 2:4b</u>, <u>Romans 1:17</u>, <u>Galatians 3:11</u> and <u>Hebrews 10:38</u>. Pastor Tom reminded us that our faith needs to be based on the "character and goodness and nature of God...even when things aren't happening the way I want and there seems to be more darkness than light." If you are not currently in God's waiting room, you know someone who is, or will be soon. How will you allow God's character, goodness and nature impact your ability to be in the waiting room, or help another as they wait?

#### MESSAGE NOTES

Unlike most <u>prophets</u> who speak for God to His people, Habakkuk is speaking to God on behalf of His people, and his message and questions to God reflect this tension of wanting to embrace God, but because what he's seeing doesn't <u>mesh</u> with what he believes, he's wrestling with God.

Wondering and listening in the dark is challenging...but waiting in the dark is really <u>hard</u>.

Note Habakkuk 2:3

### 1. Why Does God Push "Pause" at Times in Our Lives?

Waiting can be such a turbulent time in our life because we don't always know what the <u>timeline</u> is.

When God pushes "pause" in our lives, it is always to accomplish His <u>purposes</u>.

### 2. God's <u>Timelines</u> Always Include *Pauses*

Note Galatians 1-2; Acts 16; Revelation 1:9; John 2:4; 7:30

But God's pauses are never <u>permanent</u> (note <u>Habakkuk 2:3</u>).

Appointed time = "moaid" (Hebrew) = perfect, <u>unstoppable</u> timing of God.

You can't force it and you can't stop it.

Waiting doesn't mean doing nothing. Waiting means not going outside of God as we do something. (Evans)

#### 3. When I'm in God's Waiting Room...

A. Know God always has the <u>last word</u> and will accomplish His plans (note <u>Habakkuk 2:4a</u>; note the 5 <u>woes</u> in chapter 2).

And because God is always good and right in all He does, even when we don't understand His plans, we have the choice:

B. To <u>trust</u> Him (note <u>Habakkuk 2:4b</u>—along with <u>Romans 1:17</u>; <u>Galatians 3:11</u>; <u>Hebrews 10:38</u>) - my faith is to be based on the <u>character</u> and goodness and nature of God...even when things aren't happening the way I want and there seems more <u>darkness</u> than light.

#### Finding hope in the dark:

- Habakkuk doesn't get what God is doing.
- But as he <u>waits</u> in the dark, he reminds himself of such an important truth (note <u>Habakkuk 2:20</u>).
- So even when I don't see what I want to see, because of God's <u>faithfulness</u>,
   I will choose to walk by faith.
- I will follow Him and worship Him before I see Him move.
