DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: What's the weirdest thing you've seen on a back to school list?

- 1. Have you ever had someone hear you but not listen to you? How did you receive this?
- 2. Pastor Tom outlined 3 reasons why it is often challenging to listen to God. Which one stood out as most challenging to you?
- 3. Pastor Tom showed us how Peter was often hearing but not listening. What part of Peter's journey do you resonate with most right now? (note: Matthew 4:18-20; 14:24-31; 15:15-16a; 16:13-17, 21-23; 17:1-5, 24-27; 19:27; Luke 22:31-33, 54-62)
- 4. Read <u>John 21:15-22</u> and <u>Acts 4:1-3</u>. What changed for Peter and how did this change effect his actions?
- 5. In <u>2 Peter 1:12-19</u> Peter is in a dark place, he knows he is going to die. Yet, he is reminding his readers to listen. How has he grown from the moment he hears from God the Father (<u>Matthew 17:1-5</u>) to the moment he is looking back on in <u>2 Peter 1:12-19</u>?
- **6.** Re-read <u>2 Peter 1:12-19</u>. How has God been speaking to you lately? Have you been hearing or listening? How might you grow in listening to God today?

MESSAGE NOTES

The past 6 months have been filled with a lot of darkness and a <u>shortage</u> of hope.

Unlike most prophets who speak for God to His people, Habakkuk is speaking to God on behalf of His people, and his <u>message</u> and questions to God <u>reflect</u> this tension of wanting to embrace God, but because what he sees doesn't reflect what he believes, he's wrestling with God (note <u>Habakkuk 1:2-3</u>).

Habakkuk 1 = don't <u>wander</u> away from God (even when life isn't good).

Habakkuk 2 begins a new <u>challenge</u> that's very hard to do when life is difficult, challenging, painful, and dark (note <u>Habakkuk 2:1</u>).

To struggle and wonder in the dark is <u>tough</u>; but to listen in the dark is even harder (when life isn't good, all we usually hear is what our <u>pain</u>, discouragements, frustrations, doubts, and fears say to us).

1. Why is Listening Often So Challenging?

When we're hurting and life is tough, we're not very <u>motivated</u> to listen to God.

We want God to listen to us.

We want God to drop everything He's up to and fix our problems and <u>ease</u> our pain.

Note <u>Matthew 4:18-20; 14:24-31; 15:15-16a; 16:13-17, 21-23; 17:1-5, 24-27; 19:27; Luke 22:31-33, 54-62</u>

When God seemingly isn't <u>measuring</u> up to what we think He should be saying/doing, we, like Peter, have trouble listening to what God is trying to tell us...
