# **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

Icebreaker: What's the most encouraging thing you personally experienced in the past week?

- 1. Describe a time when you've felt frustrated, confused, angry, baffled or perplexed. What was your impression of the fairness of God during that time?
- 2. Read <u>Habakkuk 1:1-4</u>. What parallels can you find between the prophet's words and your conversations with God lately?
- 3. How do you reconcile the infallibility (the inability to be wrong) of God with basically saying to God, as Pastor Tom put it, "I don't think You're doing what's right."?
- 4. Are Habakkuk's issues with God your issues as well?
  - a) "God, do you even care?"
  - b) "You don't seem to be doing what you could do-You have the power. Where is it?"
- 5. Read the story of Jesus and Lazarus in <u>John 11:1-32</u>. How does this account feel like some of your experiences with God?
  - a) Have one person recap the end of the story for the group and talk about times when Jesus has answered in a way that made sense to your way of thinking/praying.
- 6. What does your current wrestling match with God look like? How can we help you embrace God even as you grapple with Him?

# "Struggling in the Dark"

#### MESSAGE NOTES

As we've been walking through the last 6 months, there's been plenty of dark times, and lots of need for and <u>shortage</u> of hope.

Habakkuk is very frustrated, confused, angry, <u>baffled</u> and perplexed; and he starts asking a question that people have been asking God throughout human history:

## 1. Why Doesn't Good Seem Fair?

Habakkuk = "to embrace" or " to wrestle".

He wants to embrace God, but what he sees isn't <u>lining up</u> with what he believes, so he's wrestling with God.

Note <u>Habakkuk 1:1</u> = vision, prophecy = utterance, burden, <u>doom</u>.

Note Habakkuk 1:2-3

His <u>wrestle</u> is the same wrestle in the 21st century...

Note <u>Habakkuk 1:3-4</u>

When it comes right down to it, he is saying to God: *I don't think You're doing what's <u>right</u>.* 

## 2. What are Habakkuk's Issues With God?

A. It doesn't seem like You care.

B. You don't seem to be doing what You <u>could do</u>— You have the <u>power</u>. Where is it? <u>Note John 11:1-7, 11-15, 17-21, 22, 28-32, 23-24, 25-26.</u>
