DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: You've been away for an extended period of time, what do you do when you get home? (Laundry and unpacking not included!)

- 1. In light of Pastor Tom's message, how is our beginning like that of both thieves? (Romans 3:23)
- **2.** We, like the two thieves, will all come to a crossroads and must decide what to do about Jesus. We can insult him, make demands and try to negotiate or we can acknowledge the truth of our guilt and need of salvation and experience true forgiveness and redemption. (Romans 10:9-10, 13)
- **3.** The result of our choice brings the same results as the thieves' decisions. Silence and separation for one, the promise of eternity with Jesus for the other. (Romans 6:23)
- 4. God allows us to choose which path we take, and today that choice is yours. Will you choose Jesus and life, or continue on your own way, hoping things will be okay in the end? Talk to God in your own words and acknowledge that you've fallen short of His standard of perfection and ask for His forgiveness, that you believe trusting in Jesus is the only way to achieve that standard and that you choose to begin following Him today.

1. ...The 2 Thieves Were Similar

- A. Both were guilty (note Luke 23:41a).
- B. Both suffering <u>pain</u> of crucifixion.
- C. Both see and hear Jesus (note Luke 23:32-34a, 38).
- D. Both want to be saved from death.
- E. And both, <u>at first</u>, join the crowd in mocking and insulting Jesus (note Matthew 27:44).

We have more in common with these 2 thieves than we may realize...

2. But...Something Starts to Change

- A. For one thief, he adds to his insults demands and <u>bargaining</u> (note <u>Luke 23:39</u>). Jesus is for some people a means to an end, a back-up <u>emergency</u> plan, a "get out of jail free" card.
- B. The 2nd thief no longer buys the <u>lies</u> about who Jesus is (note <u>Luke 23:40</u>). He acknowledged his <u>wrongs</u> (note <u>Luke 23:41a</u>). He embraced the truth about Jesus (note <u>Luke 23:41b</u>, <u>42</u>). And he says Yes to Jesus as Lord (note <u>Luke 23:42</u>).
