- 3. PASTOR TOM SAID, "IT'S IN SEASONS WHERE JESUS IS ALL YOU HAVE THAT WE DISCOVER THAT JESUS IS ALL YOU NEED." - 4. READ MARK 8:36 AS WELL AS THE TOLSTOY QUOTE FROM THE MESSAGE NOTES. WHERE HAVE YOU GONE YOUR OWN WAY IN SEARCH OF HAPPINESS? (AN YOU SEE TIMES IN YOUR LIFE WHERE, WITHOUT AN OBJECTIVE STANDARD OF GOD'S GRACE AND TRUTH, OUR LIFE IS CHAFF? EXPLAIN.

MESSAGE NOTES

<u>Existential</u> questions = concern the essence of what it means to be alive; and we tend to ask ourselves these kind of questions when the surface meaning of life is stripped away, when routines and expectations are <u>shattered</u>, and when we confront human mortality.

The first word in Psalms = $\frac{happy}{}$ (used 26 times in Psalms).

God tells us that happiness is neither inevitable or unattainable—but it is possible.

Note Psalm 1:1-6

There are two ways to live that God wants us to know:

1. Common <u>Detours</u> to Finding Happiness

- a. Remove suffering and avoid <u>pain</u> (note Psalm 1:3) if our <u>strategy</u> to be happy is to only have sunny, cloudless, warm days, we will fail. We need something <u>deeper</u> than circumstances (that we cannot control); something <u>real</u> in seasons of warm sunshine and raging blizzards (note Psalm 4:7). It's in seasons where <u>Jesus</u> is all you have that we discover that <u>Jesus</u> is all you need. Our present <u>circumstances</u> reveal what's really inside us.
- b. Misunderstand what genuine <u>freedom</u> is—happiness comes to people who have their lives deeply <u>anchored</u> in something beyond themselves (Psalm 1:3). There's only happiness when we're free <u>God's</u> way (note Psalm 1:4)...the time will come when we are <u>no more</u>. We're forgotten, and who we were and what we did slips away into the never-ending black hole of <u>obscurity</u> and lost memories. Without an objective standard of God's grace and truth, our life is <u>chaff</u>.

Is there any meaning in life that inevitable death does not destroy? ...For a time it is possible to live intoxicated with life but as soon as one is <u>sober</u>, it is impossible not to see that life in the face of death is a fraud, and a <u>stupid</u> fraud at that. (Leo Tolstoy)

Tough questions do have answers:

- ...apart from God not only is life here meaningless, but even worse, at the end we all <u>stand</u> before God (note Psalm 1:5a; Hebrews 9:27; Mark 8:36).
- What <u>accomplishment</u> will you trade for your eternal destiny?
- What earthly dream, habit, purchase, salary, and relationship will you say was worth <u>exchanging</u> for your soul for all eternity?
- There are <u>2</u> roads to take to find happiness, but only one actually takes you there: <u>God's</u> way.
- I invite you to say your own personal Yes to Jesus as Lord!
