DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER WHAT IS THE ONE THING YOU ARE SECRETLY PLEASED THAT YOU DON'T HAVE TO DO NOW THAT YOU ARE PHYSICALLY DISTANCING?

- 1. PASTOR TOM SHARED WITH US A QUESTION THAT MANY OF US ASK WHEN WE GO THROUGH CHALLENGING TIMES: "WILL MY LIFE EVER GET BETTER?" IS THIS A QUESTION THAT YOU HAVE BEEN ASKING LATELY?
- 2. PASTOR TOM EXPLAINED THAT WHILE PSALM 88 ISN'T OUR "GO-TO PASSAGE...THERE ARE TIMES THIS IS JUST WHAT LIFE FEELS LIKE." READ THROUGH PSALM 88. WHICH PHRASES OR WORDS STRIKE YOU MOST?
- 3. IN CONTRAST, PSALM 89 ASSURES US THAT "GOD'S PERFECT LOVE IS IN CHARGE...SOMETIMES HARD TO SEE...AND CONTROLS THE CONCLUSION." READ PSALM 89:1-18 AND 46-52. WHAT ARE SOME OF THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE OPENING POEM AND THIS CLOSING POEM?
- 4. HOW DO YOU RELATE TO PSALM 89? HAS PRAISE BEEN A PART OF YOUR LIFE WHEN YOU ARE STRUGGLING, OR LIFE IS DIFFICULT?
- 5.PASTOR TOM REMINDED US THAT "GOD HAS ALREADY USED PAIN IN OUR LIVES FOR GOOD." READ ROMANS 8:18, 1 PETER 5:10, 2 CORINTHIANS 4:1618 AND REVELATION 21:1-4. HOW HAVE YOU SEEN GOD TURN YOUR PAIN INTO SOMETHING GOOD?
- 6. TAKE TIME AS A GROUP TO SHARE GOOD THINGS YOU HAVE OBSERVED, EXPERIENCED, AND HEARD ABOUT SINCE THE PANDEMIC BECAME OUR CURRENT REALITY. HOW MIGHT YOU PRAISE GOD DURING THIS TIME?
- 7. PRAY TOGETHER USING PHRASES FROM PSALM 88 OR 89 OR THE THREE PHRASES PASTOR TOM USED AT THE END OF HIS MESSAGE.

"Will My Life Ever Get Better?" [Tom Lundeen, Senior Pastor]

MESSAGE NOTES

Existential questions = what we tend to ask ourselves when the surface meaning of <u>life</u> is stripped away, when <u>routines</u> and expectations are shattered, and when we confront human mortality.

Psalm <u>88</u> is probably not one that many of us read, much less memorize, or be a <u>go-to</u> passage... (note Psalm 88)

God chose to include this Psalm in His perfect and holy Word for an important reason = there are times this is just what life $\underline{\text{feels like}}$.

1. When Life Feels Like it May Never Get Better

- A. Worldwide pandemic.
- B. Feeling in the dark (note Psalm 88:6, 8b).
- C. Chronic pain (note Psalm 88:15a).
- D. Relationship conflicts (note Psalm 88:8a, 18).
- E. Loneliness (note Psalm 88:15).

God knows that in a broken world filled with broken people, some of life's chapters (sometimes <u>long ones</u>) feel like Psalm 88.

2. Why We Can Know Life Will Be Better (note Psalm 89)

Psalm 88 and 89, side-by-side, show us the <u>paradox</u> of the Christian life.

Psalm 89 assures you and me that:

- A. God's perfect love is in charge (note Psalm 89:10-12).
- B. God's perfect love is sometimes <u>hard</u> for us to see (note Psalm 89:46) Sometimes we see evidence of Romans <u>8:28</u>. Sometimes we don't see it, and may never see it <u>in this life</u>. But faith means even when I can't see it, I understand God is always working for my good, and in eternity, it will make <u>perfect sense</u>.
- C. God's perfect love <u>controls</u> the conclusion—all Psalm 88's, prayed long enough, turn into <u>praise</u>. God has already used <u>pain</u> in our lives for good. Note Romans 8:18; 1 Peter 5:10; 2 Corinthians 4:17; Revelation 21:1-4.

Tough questions do have answers:

When you feel like life will never get better:

- Pray Psalm 88.
- Preach Psalm 89 to yourself:
- I choose to not fear; God is with me.
- I choose to not doubt: God is in control.
- I choose not to despair; God is God and I'm not, and God is good.
