Discussion Guide

Ice Breaker: Is our current attitude toward money a new thing? Think about this story from John D. Rockefeller: "When asked once, 'How much money is enough money?' He replied, 'Just a little bit more." Do you feel like you have enough money? If not, how much would it take for you to say yes? Why?



- Read Matthew 6:25, 27-32. What's the difference between worrying about money, and caring about it, or being a responsible steward? What does this passage reveal about God's heart for us, His children? How should that affect our attitude about our finances?
- Pastor Tom said that worrying about money reveals three things; a divided heart, wrong priorities and misplaced trust. What are some ways that these things have showed up in your life? How are you working through them? How has God helped you overcome them? (Matthew 6:24)
- 3. "God is Big Enough." We know the truth of Matthew 6:25-34, yet there are things deep inside us which cause us to hesitate and want to trust in ourselves at the same time. What are some of those issues in your life, whether from past experiences or from outside voices who are speaking a message of "self-reliance"? How has God enabled you to overcome them and place your whole trust in His care? How might you be able to use your experience to help others find new levels of trust?
- 4. What are some ways that you can shift your focus away from money and things back to God? Read Matthew 6:31-34 and consider that question again. What would it look like for you to go all in on that command? What would need to change in your everyday life and priorities, your long-term planning and goals? Will you put Jesus first and take a next step with Him in serving God, not money?

1. Worry is a Dead-End (note Matthew 6:25, 27-32)

Jesus isn't opposed to careful provision for the <u>future</u>; but He's very interested in our a<u>ttitude</u> about money and things... (note Matthew 6:25a).

2. God is Big Enough (note Matthew 6:25-34)

Sometimes we worry about money and things:

- Because of experiences in our past...
- Because of who we listen to/watch/read/follow...

If we're trusting in money and "stuff" to make us happy and <u>ascribing</u> to money and things the supreme place that only belongs to God, it means our view of God is small (note Matthew 6:25).
