Ice Breaker: What was the most memorable part of your Easter weekend?

Talk It Over Together: (Note: If your group is only meeting bi-weekly, cover the first 2 discussion questions of each week. If time allows, go back to the remaining questions.)

- 1. Take some time to read through the bullet points listed under section 2 in the sermon notes. Do any of these powers surprise or stand out to you? Which of these powers are the most disturbing to you? Read and discuss (Ephesians 6:10-20). Do you feel it is important to spend time in preparation for "The Fight of Your Life"? If so, how does this affect your personal relationship with Jesus by putting on the full armor of God?
- 2. Pastor Tom explained that the devil is powerful, but not all-powerful. He is not God, equal with God, or even like God. Read (Genesis 3:14-15). His destiny is doom and the Lord has placed an eternal curse upon him. Read and discuss (Revelation 12:7-10; 20:1-3, 10). Now read and discuss the Tozer quote at the end of the sermon notes.
- 3. Pastor Tom quoted C.S. Lewis when he said, "There are two equal and opposite errors into which our race can fall about the devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them." Share with your group what you believe about the existence of the devil. Read and discuss (2 Corinthians 4:1-6). Verse 4 states that the enemy blinds the minds of unbelievers. How does this strike you? What does this passage conclude that we should do in light of this reality? What does that look like here and now?
- 4. The Bible gives us many different names that describe the devil throughout scripture. Some examples of these are Satan, devil, tempter, father of lies, deceiver, destroyer, evil one, god of this world, murderer, etc. Share with your group which name resonates with you and affects you the most. Read aloud to your group the corresponding verse to that name in this week's sermon notes. How does understanding his tactics help us to stand against him?

## **PERSONAL READING**

As you read through each passage, consider answering 3 simple questions: What did I learn about God from what I read? What Did I learn about myself? What is God asking me to do as a result?
