Ice Breaker: Share with the group about a time when you were outwitted or you outwitted someone else.

Talk It Over Together: (Note: If your group is only meeting bi-weekly, cover the first 2 discussion questions of each week. If time allows, go back to the remaining questions.)

- 1. Pastor Tom explained how Satan twists and perverts the truth to turn us away from God. Read Genesis 3:1-6 and Matthew 4:1-11. How does Satan twist the truth in these passages? Has this kind of deception ever happened to you? Explain.
- 2. Read and discuss 1 Corinthians 14:33a and 2 Timothy 1:7. Have you ever allowed fear or confusion to impact your decision-making process? What was the result? How have you grown from this experience?
- 3. Share with the group about a time you were not well prepared. How could the outcome have been different if you had been well prepared? Read and discuss Ephesians 6:11 and 2 Corinthians 2:11. How does putting on the full armor of God help you prepare against the evil one's schemes?
- 4. Pastor Tom outlined five ways the evil one deceives us (see message notes). Review these five with your group and discuss which one(s) you are most vulnerable to. Satan's deception often looks attractive. Read and discuss 2 Corinthians 11:4 and 1 Peter 5:8. Have you ever been deceived by something that originally was attractive but turned out ugly? Explain.
