While most people have an opinion on what they think love is, and books have been written to and distinguish the various kinds of love, the Bible clearly indicates there is only one way to understand what real love actually is: 1. Love is Found and Ultimately _____ by Jesus **Christ and His Cross** Note I John 3:16 There is "only one act of pure love, u_____ by any taint of ulterior motive" that "has ever been performed in the history of the world, namely the self-giving of God in Christ on the cross for underserving sinners." (Stott) When seeking to define love, our search shouldn't take us to a dictionary, Wikipedia, or a Hollywood movie script, but to a cross at 2.000 years ago. Note Romans 3:23-26; I John 4:9-10 and John 3:16 In sending Jesus, God sent His own self to the full extent of this punishment, to die that death instead of us. In light of the cross, evil and pain and suffering are properly illuminated, because in the pain, evil and suffering of the cross, God's love is publically and visibly
