DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: Who is your favorite cartoon character from your childhood, and what is it that you like best about them?

- 1. What was your first job, and how do you think it shaped how you've viewed your subsequent jobs?
- 2. Pastor Tony explained that God gave us work as a gift. Have you ever thought of work that way?
- 3. Who do you work for and how does that fact impact your work?
- 4. How do you struggle with the tension of "Clear Thinking vs Faulty Thinking"? How about the tension of "Foundation vs Panic"?
- **5.** Pastor Tony stated in the Message Notes that "Power doesn't inherently equal leadership." Many of us have probably seen this in a negative way. When have you experienced this in a positive way?
- 6. Read through the final 4 passages listed in the Message Notes (Colossians 3:23-24, 2 Thessalonians 3:10-12, Hebrews 13:17 and Exodus 20:8) and discuss what it means to Work for the Boss, Care like a boss, Invest into your boss and Rest or face a loss.
- 7. In his conclusion, Pastor Tony indicated "retirement will reveal who and what you've really been working for." How might this perspective help you this week as you consider your job/career (or your retirement if you're lucky enough to be in this phase of life)?

- God wants to speak transformation into everyone around us through us... we are all <u>ESSENTIAL</u> workers.

TENSION: Normal vs Common (Exodus 5:1-2)

- Power doesn't inherently equal <u>LEADERSHIP</u>.
- It's easier to take a stand if you first <u>SIT DOWN</u>.

Instead of back to the future:

- WORK for the Boss (Colossians 3:23-24)
- CARE like a boss (2 Thessalonians 3:10-12)
- INVEST into your boss (Hebrews 13:17)
- REST or face a loss (Exodus 20:8)

Don't miss this: <u>Retirement</u> will reveal who and what you've really been working for. Why not decide now who and what that will be?
