Since God never wastes anything, He hasn't intended for us to go on this difficult and <u>challenging</u> journey so that the end result will be that we just go back to what we were, or just develop a *new normal*.

God wants to lead us to an extraordinary life that we could only begin to experience by having <u>walked</u> through these painful circumstances and hard times.

None of us like to wait/be delayed.

- Noah (100 years before the Flood).
- Abraham (25 years for promised child).
- Isaac (20 years for twin boys).
- Moses (40 years in exile from Egypt in the desert).
- Joseph (<u>13</u> years to become Prime Minister of Egypt).
- David (15 years to become King of Israel).

God is never <u>rushed</u> or in a hurry.

So what has God been wanting us to learn about the waiting we've been experiencing?

1. Delays Display Our Real Motives (note 2 Kings 6:24-33)

Waiting brings out either the best or worst in people.

- Noah (<u>preacher</u> of righteousness, 2 Peter 2:5).
- Abraham (<u>rollercoaster</u> of faith, note Genesis 15:4-6; 16:1-2).
- Moses (note Exodus 3:10-11; Deuteronomy 34:10-12).
- Joseph (note Genesis 50:19-20).
- David (note Psalm 27:14).

What have the delays and waiting you've been experiencing these months <u>revealed</u> about what your genuine motives are?

2. Delays Can Develop Patience (note James 1:2-4; 2 Peter 1:5-8)

Patience is a building block of spiritual maturity.

It helps us have the right perspective about what really matters.

Have the delays you've been experiencing the past 4 months been expanding or contracting patience in your life?

3. Delays Create Anticipation (note James 5:7)

Are the delays you've been experiencing the past 4 months creating a <u>positive</u> anticipation for the future?

4. Delays Renovate our Character and Heart

Are the delays you're experiencing doing a renovation project in your life?

Instead of back to the future:

- Delays/waiting is never <u>fun</u>.
- We may not always understand why we have to wait at times in our lives or experience delays, but the <u>great news</u> is this...
- God never asks us to wait without Him.
