DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: What is your most used emoji? If you can't readily identify it, check your texts; what was the last one you used and why?

1. Pastor Nate reminded us that it's easy to "buy into the lie that our phones and our own grit allow us to find consistent success on our own." When has technology and the "world's information at our fingertips" isolated or disconnected you from others?

2. Read John 13:34 and Hebrews 10:24-25a. How do these verses speak to or support our need for each other?

3. Read <u>Ecclesiastes 3:4, 13</u> and <u>John 15:11</u>. How and what has your group been able to celebrate together?

4. Pastor Nate reminded us how important it is to be in a small group as you go through crises. Read John 6:66-67 and Matthew 26:38. Just as Jesus needed a small group of trusted friends during his most difficult days, we need each other during a crisis. Recall a time when your group has been able to support you through a difficult time. How did their "gift of courage" impact you?

5. How has your group helped you to be accountable in your life?

6. Pastor Nate showed us that there are "no 'double bonus points' for doing life by yourself". Why and in what ways have you been tempted to try and live life on your own?

7. Read <u>John 13:34-35</u>. What is our group commanded to be known by? As we lean into this, how can we influence others as we grow through celebration, crises and accountability?
