- **6.** Re-read <u>Matthew 6:10-13.</u> How does genuine prayer ground us in reality and point us to eternity?
- **7.** After reading <u>Hebrews 4:16</u>, take time to consider and pray some bold prayers as a group, asking God to show you that "In prayer you can be the genuine, honest, unfiltered you with the genuine, honest, unfiltered King, and still be completely loved."
