- **2.** Andy Stanley references a "red flag moment" where we just know that something is...off. The Bible calls that our conscience. (1 Timothy 1:5, 1 Peter 3:16) Share some examples of how your conscience has saved the day for you.
- **3.** What were some of the advantages that Samson had going for him which should have set him up for success? <u>Judges 13:2-3</u>, <u>21-25</u>, <u>14:6</u>, <u>19a</u>, <u>15:14-15</u>
- **4.** What are some of the advantages that God has given you to work with in your life that have set you up for success?
- **5.** Samson made it a life long practice to ignore good counsel and his own conscience when it came to relationships with women and exercising good judgment. <u>Judges 14:1-4</u>, <u>15-17</u> & <u>16:4-6</u> How are you making sure that you don't go down the same road that Samson travelled?

1. Let's Make Sure We Have a Whole Picture of Samson

Samson seems like an easy person to identify as some kind of muscle-bound idiot with character flaws <u>oozing</u> out of every pore.

- A. His <u>birth</u> was miraculous (note <u>Judges 13:2</u>) announced by an <u>angel</u> (note <u>Judges 13:3</u>).
- B. God's <u>call</u> was upon his life before he was even conceived.
- C. He's the first identified Nazarite.
- D. God gave him incredible physical strength for the purpose of delivering Israel from an <u>oppressing</u> nation...during the <u>darkest</u> days of Israel's history as a nation (note <u>Judges 14:6, 19a; 15:14-15</u>).

There was much to admire about Samson, and in many ways, he was a <u>type</u> of Christ

Note Hebrews 11:32-34

2. But Samson Rarely Paid Attention to the Tension

Despite God's call, empowerment, and equipping for leadership in very challenging times, Samson's life and legacy is seen by most people as a <u>waste</u> of God's gifts and grace.

...because when it came to his <u>sexual</u> appetite, Samson ignored his conscience.

He ignored his <u>parent's</u> advice (<u>Judges 14:1-4</u>).

But this revealed in Samson not just a one-off lack of judgment, but a weakness that would come to <u>define</u> his life and legacy...

So Samson fell into a pattern of his <u>own making</u>, and his pride and his passions kept propelling him towards disaster (note <u>Judges 14:15-17</u>; <u>16:4-6</u>).

Am I making better decisions so I can have fewer regrets?:

- God isn't looking for <u>perfect</u> people, because there aren't any.
- But not listening to his God-given conscience, not paying attention to the tension leaves any honest person studying and reviewing his life and legacy to throw up their hands in wonder, How could he be a person of faith but also lack character and integrity?
- Reality is like Samson, we can be people of faith in many ways, but in one or more parts of our life not pay attention to the tension/our conscience.
- Blind spots are <u>easy</u> to see in others; but <u>harder</u> to see in ourselves.
