### **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

Icebreaker: Would you rather have to spend an entire day in full clown makeup, or in a pink gorilla suit?

- 1. Pastor Tom described a "giant" as a problem/obstacle that paralyzes us from moving forward. When was the last time you encountered something like this, and how did you try to solve it?
- 2. Read <u>1 Samuel 17:4-11</u>. Despite having God on their side, the entire Israelite army was terrified by one man's words. Why do you think it's so easy to be trapped by fear?
- 3. Read <u>1 Samuel 17:38-40</u>, & <u>45, 47</u>. In contrast to the giant's boasting, David spoke boldly of God's deliverance. How may those in earshot (the Israelite army, the Philistines and David) have responded?
- 4. How have you experienced faith-filled words, spoken aloud, equip you to act boldly for God?
- 5. In the end, the only "protection" David brought into battle was his faith in God. What are some substitutes you have used, or are using to replace your faith in God?
- **6.** Share any existing "giants" in your life you have yet to fully entrust to God. Pray for one another, and find specific ways to encourage each other throughout your week.

#### **MESSAGE NOTES**

Giants are problems/obstacles that <u>loom</u> large over us, often produce fear, and paralyze us moving forward.

Everyone <u>encounters</u> giants in their life.

What do you do when you encounter a giant in your life?

#### 1. This is History

This is a real story in a real place with real people.

We need to remember that all history is His-Story.

God is the author of history and the Scriptures are a compilation and intersection of divine and human history.

David and Goliath: Underdogs, Misfits, and the <u>Art</u> of Battling Giants (by Malcolm Gladwell)

#### 2. This is a Real Place (note 1 Samuel 17:1-3)

This encounter takes place in an identified geographic location.

<u>Shefela</u> = in between plains and mountains...<u>extremely strategic</u> and many battles fought for control of Israel here.

### 3. These are Real Peoples

Philistines—they are a real nation and people that were prominent for 300 years; they came from the island of <u>Crete</u>.

King Saul gets word and brings his army down from the mountains to meet the Philistines in the Valley of Elah.

- A. Goliath (note <u>1 Samuel 17:4-11</u>, <u>41-44</u>) his armor, size, and his record (<u>champion</u>) kept the entire army of Israel <u>paralyzed</u> by fear for 40 days. He also moves <u>slowly</u> and seems to take a while to figure out what's going on (note <u>1 Samuel 17:43-44</u>). <u>Giantism</u> or <u>acromegaly</u> = caused by a tumor on the pituitary gland producing too much human growth hormone. A common side effect = severely restricted <u>vision</u>. What gave him his great size was also his greatest <u>weakness</u>.

It would have the same force as a bullet from a <u>45</u> caliber hand gun. Extremely <u>accurate</u> (note <u>1 Chronicles 12:2a</u> and <u>Judges 20:16</u>).
