DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: If you had to choose to be born in a different decade (i.e. the 70s, 80s, 90s, etc.), which would you choose and why? What if you had to be born in a different country?

- 1. Are you the type of person that deals with accusations calmly, or passionately? How can your reaction differ, depending on who's making the accusation?
- 2. Read <u>1 Samuel 17:17-23 & 26-28</u>. How would you respond if put in David's position? In your opinion, what do you think caused Eliab's accusations in the first place?
- 3. Read <u>1 Samuel 17:29-30</u>. Why do you think David left his brother to continue the conversation elsewhere? How can his behavior speak into how you respond to the voices in your life?
- 4. Review point 4 of the Message notes and read <u>1 Samuel 17:31-37</u>. Have there been times when you've had to disregard expert advice and how did that turn out?
- 5. Share at least one area of life that you are currently facing giants of adversity or doubt. Pray together, asking for God's guidance and sustainment.

"FACING OUR GIANTS" (Part 2)

MESSAGE NOTES

Giants are problems/obstacles that loom large over us, often produce fear, and paralyze us moving <u>forward</u>.

Everyone has to face *aiants* in their lives.

What most of us don't realize is that before David ever faced Goliath, he had to face at least 4 other *giants* that all of us will also face.

1. Paralyzing Interruptions

2. Shattering Disappointments

Disparaging Accusations

No one wants to be rejected, looked down on, talked to rudely, have our <u>motives</u> questioned, and be dressed down in front of others.

But if you really want to follow Jesus and embrace His purposes and dreams, know that not everyone will <u>applaud</u> you and pat you on the back.

Note 1 Samuel 17:26-29 and 16:6-7

Sometimes even people <u>close</u> to you can't always see how God is at work in your life.

It's hard to navigate rejection and personal attacks.

Note Mark 3:20-21 and John 7:1-5

There's always a tension to navigate...

We will have to navigate at times whether God's <u>approval</u> is more important to you and me than the <u>approval</u> of people...

4. Nagging Doubts

Doubts can be self-doubts.

But often feeding into any <u>self</u>-doubt are the doubts others have <u>aimed</u> at us. After dealing with his older brother's disparaging words, he now had to deal with the most important <u>military</u> expert in Israel.

Note 1 Samuel 17:26, 30-31, 32-33

The experts aren't always right.

What's your giant?:

- Who am I <u>listenina</u> to?
- If I mostly only listen to the giants, I'll <u>drown in a sea</u> of paralyzing interruptions/delays, and shattering disappointments.
- And if I'm mostly listening to the voices of others who may be close to
 me, or who supposedly know more than me, I'll be <u>swamped</u> and stuck
 by their disparaging words and by the nagging doubts that swirl
 ground.
- There are more <u>voices</u> in today's world than ever before that create giants in our lives, and they get their <u>power</u> in our lives when we listen to them more than we listen to God.
- So who we listen to <u>the most</u> makes all the difference when we face giants in our lives (note <u>Psalm 18:35</u>).
