DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: Are you in the "It's got to be a white Christmas!" camp, or would you prefer a Florida Keys Christmas?

- 1. What comes to mind when you hear *O Little Town of Bethlehem* and contemplate what's influenced your life most...hopes or fears?
- 2. Read <u>Luke 2:8-10</u>. How would you react if God announced that He had good news for you? He just did, so how did you react?
- 3. Read <u>Isaiah 9:2</u> & <u>Luke 2:9</u>. Pastor Tom said that darkness produces fear, but light brings hope. Where do you find yourself today, still walking in the darkness or bathed in the light of hope? Explain your answer to the group if you're willing. (After answering, stop and pray for those walking in the darkness.)
- 4. Read <u>Isaiah 9:6</u>. How has Jesus lived up to these things in your life, in the lives of those around you? What role do you need to choose to trust Him in today or this week?
- **5.** What are some of your go-to excuses you use to keep from taking faithfilled steps in your life?
- 6. If you're a Christ follower, what responsibility have you taken back that rightfully belongs to God, and what will you do about it? If you've never said your own personal YES! to Jesus (your letter of resignation) what's holding you back from doing that right now?

- C. Everlasting Father He knows us, warts and all, and still loves us...
- D. Prince of <u>Peace</u> (note <u>John 14:27</u>)
- E. The <u>government</u> will rest on His shoulders what this means is that Jesus can bear the full weight of the world and all it's <u>problems</u> (Pritchard). Too many of us are <u>frazzled</u>, full of anxiety, and bearing a weight we were not created to carry. We act as if we are the <u>general manager</u> of the universe...Christmas reminds you and me that we're not in <u>charge</u>. God is God and <u>I'm not</u>.

Christmas matters because:

- Christmas reminds us God is God and we're not. He can arrange for a virgin to become pregnant. He can cause a Roman emperor to order a <u>census</u> at precisely the right moment in history. He can ensure the baby will be born at exactly the place prophesied 700 years earlier. He can put a star in the sky at the right moment. He can bring together angels, shepherds, and Wise Men to celebrate that miraculous birth. And He can take a tiny baby born in a stable and make that baby the <u>Savior</u> of the world. (Pritchard)
- The light of Jesus that started shining from a manger still shines today in our dark world.
- He's just waiting for your letter of resignation as general manager of the universe, or just <u>your</u> universe.
