- Notice, when we do this, we're tempted to "paint over the dirt."
- Notice, your <u>whole family</u> has shaped you.

- Rehoboam... Jacob: Corrupt (or good) kings, politicians, royal descendants, priests and a few "names".
- Joseph: A messy, distinguished heritage, and he's engaged to Mary.

#### Why?

The superb and scandalous people in Jesus' genealogy...

We're invited to join God not just on the basis of what we've done...

"Good News" always has a back story. (See Matthew 1:18-21)

Notice, Joseph is to do the <u>naming</u>.

Notice, God can draw straight using crooked lines.

There is no guarantee of <u>understanding</u>. (See <u>Luke 2:1-7</u>)

Notice, no one in Joseph's family made room.

Notice, Mary wrapped Jesus.

#### Christmas matters because:

- We aren't just from an <u>extended family</u>...we are the <u>extended family</u>.
   (See <u>2 Corinthians 5:16-18</u>)
- Every decision an ancestor ever made shaped everyone after them...and that kind of impact is just as real <u>for you</u>.
- Jesus' genealogy shows He is the Savior for the <u>Jews</u>, the <u>non-Jews</u>, the <u>successful</u>, the <u>failures</u>, the <u>somebodies</u>, the <u>nobodies</u>...in every <u>generation</u>, Amen.
