DISCUSSION GUIDE

Icebreaker: What's something "Christmas-y" you want to do before the season is over? What are some of the fun traditions you like to do on Christmas Day?

- 1. Read <u>Luke 2:8-9</u>. Imagine you were one of the shepherds. How do you think you would react to the angels' appearance? What thoughts would go through your mind?
- 2. Read <u>Luke 2:10-14</u>. Pastor Tom talked about how the Truth of Christmas produces two responses: fear, and then joy. Why do you think "fear" comes before "joy"?
- 3. How do our responses of "fear" and "joy" relate to how we ultimately respond to Jesus? How does this connect to Pastor Tom's point that "the Truth of Christmas requires a choice"?
- 4. Read <u>Luke 2:15-18</u>. While their encounter with the angels was definitely a once-in-a-lifetime experience, the biggest change in the shepherds' lives happened after they chose to respond to God. How is God prompting you to respond to Him through this Christmas season?
- 5. After sharing your responses, pray for the person on your left.

Note Luke 2:11

Whenever you or I hear the message of Jesus...it is always for the purpose of calling us to make a choice, to <u>decide</u> what we're going to do with Jesus.

- ...He uses His creation to constantly remind us that He is the <u>Creator</u> (note <u>Psalm 19:1-4; Romans 1:20</u>).
- He gave us a <u>conscience</u> so we understand (despite the efforts of the culture to deny this reality) that there is right and wrong, and what we have done is wrong/sinned (note <u>Romans 2:15</u>).
- And then He has revealed Himself through His truth/Word and through Jesus (note John 1:1-5, 10-13).

It was a <u>group</u> of angels giving God's message to a <u>group</u> of people, and it was auite a production (note <u>Luke 2:8-14</u>).

1. The Truth of Christmas is for Real People

Note Luke 2:8

The great good news of Christmas isn't just for the <u>popular</u> and powerful.

It's not for *perfect people*.

No one is excluded, overlooked, or forgotten (note Luke 2:10).

2. The Truth of Christmas Produces Two Responses

- A. <u>Fear</u>—the shepherds caught a <u>glimpse</u> of heaven and just a glance at who God really is (note <u>Luke 2:9</u>). The gospel (<u>good news</u>) only becomes good when you and I recognize the not so good news, that you and I are people with spiritually defective DNA who've offended a holy and perfect God, and we need to humbly <u>repent</u> and say 'YES!' to Jesus as Lord.
- B. <u>Joy</u>—the shepherd's initial response of fear shifted to joy when they realized that this holy God had not come in judgment, but had come to <u>solve</u> their greatest problem... (note <u>Luke 2:10</u>)
