## **MESSAGE NOTES**

450 to 1 odds mean% chance of winning.
In our series we're learning what it means to stand for God and His truth and embrace His when everyone and everything around us is standing for anything and everything else but God and His truth.
I think a lot of us as Jesus followers look at what's happening around our world today in 2022 where there is so much anger, division,, violence, disillusionment, and hopelessness that we feel like the odds are against us are 1 to 450.  But Elijah will demonstrate why the odds are never
for God and for everyone who follows and trusts Him.
1. All are not Simply Different Paths to the Same God  In Elijah's day, the people of Israel were trying to their faith in the one true God (Yahweh), with the gods of the surrounding nations, especially:

- 4. What are some ways that having misguided faith can be worse than having no faith at all?
- 5. After reading Elijah's response in <u>1 Kings 18:30-37</u>, along with God's response in <u>verse 38</u>, what are some of the differences between Elijah and God, and the 450 prophets and Baal?
- 6. Where are you today—mixing and matching and hoping for the best, or confidently committed to God alone? What's holding you back from placing your whole confidence in God, and how can we help you work through it?

But Elijah will demonstrate why the odds are never <u>stacked too high</u> for God and for everyone who follows and trusts Him.

# 1. All Religions are not Simply Different Paths to the Same God

In Elijah's day, the people of Israel were trying to <u>mix and match</u> their faith in the one true God (Yahweh), with the gods of the surrounding nations, especially:

- <u>Baal</u> = god of fertility and storms (rain!).
- Asherah = consort of Baal, goddess of fertility and motherhood.

It's not a coincidence that God commands Elijah to proclaim a drought (3  $\frac{1}{2}$  years long!) in direct opposition to the <u>supposed</u> god of thunder/rain/storms.
