Icebreaker: Share one of your favorite childhood memories with the group, along with *why* it is a favorite.

- 1. If I had to rate my view of prayer on a scale of 1-10, 1 being a "dreaded obligation" and 10 being "a wonderful privilege", it would be a... (James 5:17-18)
- 2. Elijah did not put on airs or hype himself up, he just prayed a simple prayer which God then answered. (1 Kings 18:36-38) What are some ways that this can bring freedom in my prayer life?
- 3. The prayer of Elijah was that God would reveal Himself to the people once again. He did not ask for anything specific, just what God wanted accomplished. How does the way I pray line up with God's expressed will for my life? (1 Kings 8:35-36)
- 4. Is God's character what causes me to persevere in prayer? Do I know what God wants for me? "Prayer isn't getting God to change His purposes and plans, but it is about changing my desires to embrace God's plans and purposes." What are some ways that I can take steps forward in this? (<u>Luke 11:5-10</u>, <u>2 Timothy 3:16</u>)
- 5. My part to play begins with saying 'YES!' to Jesus, and starting to follow Him. Have I done that? If not, what is holding me back? If I have said my own 'YES!', what is my next step in moving my prayer life closer to a 10?

1. Genuineness

Prayer throughout the Bible...is to be primarily understood as asking God to <u>come</u> <u>through</u> on what He already promised. (Millar)

Prayer isn't getting God to change His purposes and plans, but it is about changing my desires to <u>embrace</u> God's plans and purposes.
