- 1. Pastor Tom pointed out that when people ask if "good things are going to come true," they are really asking about where the world is headed and what their life's destination is. Have you encountered people asking these questions, and how have you answered them?
- 2. "The main point of eschatology is all about the problem of evil and how that problem will be solved." How have you struggled with solving the problem of evil in your world?
- 3. Evil..."at its foundation is a violation of God's law, truth, will and purpose...(has) a spiritual source...and is so pervasive in the human family that while not everyone's sins are identical, the consequence of everyone's sins is identical." Read <u>John 8:44</u>; <u>Jeremiah 17:9</u> and <u>James 1:13-15</u>; <u>2:10</u>. How do these verses support the truth that people are not getting "better"?
- 4. Jesus offers genuine hope for the problem of evil for us in a personal way. Read <u>John 8:12</u>, <u>11:25-26</u>, <u>14:27</u>; <u>16:33</u> and <u>Colossians 2:13-15</u>. How have you embraced these truths in your life when you have fallen short or been discouraged by what you have experienced and seen around you?
- 5. "In a world that seems increasingly dark and hopeless, and where the evil desires and choices of people are the source of so much pain and suffering, God has the only way to make sure that justice is done and also mercy and grace prevail." Read Revelation 11:15b, 21:5a, Isaiah 38:17, Psalm 103:10 and Romans 6:23. How do these verses as well as the Keller quote in the message notes help you further understand God's genuine hope for you personally and for our world as a whole?
- 6. Take time to pray together, thanking God for how He has provided for mercy, grace, and justice to prevail.

There's a lot of fake news about the Church Jesus bled and died and rose to create.

...this isn't asking if good things are going to come true...it's instead saying that sad things will come untrue.

What's really being asked in all of this is, Where is this world headed? Where is my life's final destination?

Eschatology = the <u>science</u> of the last things...the end of history, the resurrection of the dead, the final judgment, and the vindication of God's justice. (Encyclopedia Britannica)

The main point of eschatology is all about the problem of evil and how that problem will be solved. (Kruger)

1. Everyone Has an Eschatology

Everyone has to navigate how evil is going to be dealt with. The only difference is what is the basis for our eschatology?

I believe that anyone who honestly examines and evaluates the Christian understanding of eschatology will see it is consistent, captivating, and the most persuasive and powerful answer to the problem of evil in this world.

2. What Christian Eschatology Explains

A. Why this world is broken - in just one century (1917-2017), communism (which denies God's existence and required atheism as the official government position) was responsible for 100 million deaths...more than the rest of recorded human history. Why don't people get better? (note Genesis 2:16-17; Romans 3:23; 5:12).

- B. What evil is...at it's foundation a violation of God's law, truth, will, and purpose. Evil has a spiritual source (note John 8:44; d-evil) and is at the core of every human being (note Jeremiah 17:9)...and evil is so pervasive in the human family that while note everyone's sins are identical, the consequence of everyone's sins is identical (note James 1:13-15; 2:10; Romans 6:23a).
- C. There is hope for the future Note Ephesians 6:12. Sin twists and ruins everything. But Jesus came into a broken, dark, sad world and brought light (note John 8:12a), life (note John 8:12b), and hope in the face of death's endless repetition (note John 11:25). Even though sadness and difficulties and pain are still present, Jesus promises His peace, presence, and power to navigate the world's darkness (note John 14:27; 16:33). And His work on the cross and from the tomb became the eventual sentence of death for death... (note Colossians 2:13-15). God will destroy evil and make everything right (note Revelation 11:15b; 21:5a). But He will do it in such a way that mercy and grace also prevail: Evil is so deeply rooted in the human heart that if Christ had come in power to destroy it everywhere He found it, He would have to destroy us, too. He did not come to earth the first time to bring justice, but to bear it. He died on the cross in our place, taking the punishment our sins deserve, so that someday He can return to earth and end evil without <u>destroying</u> us all. (Keller) - Note <u>Isaiah 38:17</u>; <u>Psalm 103:10</u>; Romans 6:23
