v.2-3 "You won't spend the rest of your lives chasing your own desires, but you will be anxious to do the will of God..."

• Jesus didn't teach "<u>American</u>" values. We're not called to support "<u>pride</u>" or "<u>freedom</u>" but <u>grieve</u> over sin, starting in us.

v.4-6 "But remember that they will have to face God..."

• We're not called to win arguments and deflate people but to win people and deflate arguments. (Look up <u>2 Corinthians 10:5</u>)

v.7"...the end of the world..."

• This is not merely an event, but actual erosion.

A quick wilderness detour via Exodus 13:17-18

- "Midbar": Wilderness you can personally <u>survive</u>.
- "Şîyâ": Wilderness you'll need help through.
- "Jeshimon": Wilderness you'll die in short of a miracle.

Like the Israelites, we can quickly misunderstand the purpose of our <u>freedom</u> and His <u>path/way</u>. God's detours are not about distraction or discouragement but about development.
