Here are the 3 qualifications to engage in baptism:

- 1. You need to be a follower of Jesus.
- 2. You need to have not be baptized as an adult believer in Christ already.
- 3. You need to be at least 12 years old.

(We do baptize children younger than 12 if they have parental support and have talked it through with our Riverside Kids leaders. Riverside Kids also has a discipleship class called **No Limits** for children under 12; they are given a chance to engage in baptism after completing this course; details at <u>myrc.church/nolimits</u>)

Don't get baptized:

- If you're not sure about following Jesus.
- If you're trying to impress others.
- If you think it would be a "cool" experience with your friends/family. Do what Jesus calls you to do.

1. What the New Testament Tells Us About Water Baptism

- A. What baptism means "Baptizo" = "to <u>dip</u>...to immerse"
 - I would have those who are to be baptized to be <u>entirely</u> immersed, as the work imports and the mystery signifies. (Martin Luther)
 - The word 'baptize' signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the <u>ancient</u> church. (John Calvin)
 - Buried with Him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the <u>custom</u> of the first church. (John Wesley)
- B. John the Baptist his ministry shows us that baptism was not a new idea <u>invented</u> by Christians, or even by John the Baptist.
 - Baptism = always a symbolic <u>act</u>.
 - John the "Baptizer" practiced a baptism that symbolized repentance. (note Matthew 3:7-11a).
- C. Baptism of Jesus His baptism was <u>symbolic</u> of a number of things:
 - It was to "<u>fulfill</u> all righteousness" (note <u>Matthew 3:15</u>)
 - Fulfilled the mission of John the Baptist and marked the start of Jesus' <u>public</u> ministry.
 - Jesus identified Himself with the <u>sinful</u> condition of humanity which He had come to save.
 - It is an example to <u>all</u> His followers.
- D. Other New Testament examples baptism practiced <u>very soon</u> after commitment to Jesus Christ, so much so that often baptism and salvation closely tied together:
 - Acts 2, Pentecost
 - Acts 8, Samarian converts and Ethiopian government official
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Every example of baptism in the New Testament is believer's baptism (no examples of <u>infant</u> baptism).

Note <u>Matthew 28:18-20</u>. Baptism is an outward sign and symbol of what has happened inwardly and spiritually to a person who commits their life to Jesus <u>by faith</u>. The <u>act</u> of baptism does not provide salvation.
