## "HOW'S MY DRIVING?"

#### **MESSAGE NOTES**

The reality is that every single person...is <u>driven</u> by something. <u>Drive</u> = to guide, control, direct.

...way too many of us are driven by the unhealthy need for approval.

We allow the <u>expectations</u> of others to control our lives. If you follow the wrong crowd/group, you usually get <u>lost</u> in it. A certain key to fail in life is trying to <u>please</u> everyone.

When we're <u>preoccupied</u> with the approval of others, then:

### 1. Our Main Life Priority Gets Distorted

Note Matthew 22:34-36

In 2021, "#selfie" was used <u>422.6 million</u> times... "#Jesus" wasn't in the top <u>50</u> hashtags in 2021.

#### Note Matthew 22:37-38

Loving God (not *phileo* = friendly affection, <u>brotherly</u> love; but *agapao* = choosing for the <u>highest</u> good of another...).

When we're focused/obsessed with being approved by others...living a life of unreserved love and commitment for God becomes impossible.

When we're preoccupied with being "liked" and approved of, we have broken priorities and a <u>blurred</u> focus of what really matters.

Having others' approval driving and controlling our lives is spiritually <u>debilitating</u>.

It's not that we shouldn't try to get along with others or have people like us. But having God as our first priority will help us be in a spiritually <u>healthier</u>, more balanced place.

### 2. We Become Me-Centered

Note Matthew 22:39-40

Hypocrisy = one who wears a mask, plays a part.

Note Matthew 23:5-7, 12, 25-28

...despite our claims to wanting <u>authenticity</u>, Millennials were at the forefront of developing the <u>selfie culture</u>, and all other generations have embraced it to various extents, and social media has created for many of us an engine that requires the <u>fuel</u> of approval to every video, photo, or post that we make.

Are we <u>crowdsourcing</u> approval and affirmation? (Stone) Note Galatians 1:10; Proverbs 29:25; Colossians 3:23
