

# **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

#### - Icebreaker -

Share an unexpected kindness or grace from an unexpected source that was done for you this past week. Then, praise God together for His gifts of kindness that we can so easily miss if we're not paying attention.

- 1. In this week's reading in **Unoffendable** (Chapters 5-8), the author uses several stories to illustrate the freedom we can experience by being unoffendable. Which story impacted you most, and why?
- In his message, Pastor Tom spoke of "those people" who regularly
  offend us due to things like arrogance, negativity, a critical spirit,
  meanness, etc. What are the characteristics of "those people" for you
   the ones practically guaranteed to set you off?
- 3. Read <u>Ephesians 4:27</u>. Pastor Tom said that the devil uses this foothold to destroy us, distract us, and, ultimately, discredit us in the eyes of people who need Jesus. How has this happened to you and how might it have been avoided? What have you done to release this "foothold" in your life?
- 4. Read <u>Ephesians 4:29</u> and <u>James 3:2-10</u>. Considering these Scriptures, why is it essential for followers of Jesus to become "unoffendable" people, and what are the potential consequences of an "offended tongue?"
- 5. Pastor Tom said that being offended is inevitable, but taking offense is a choice. <u>Ephesians 4:31-32</u> shares that the secret of consistently choosing not to take offense is to "put away" bitterness, anger, resentment etc. How do you "put away" these destructive emotions?

## "THOSE PEOPLE"

...we live in a *Cancel Culture* world where people are <u>constantly</u> either in the state of being offended, or looking for a way to be offended. Is it actually <u>possible</u> to live an unoffendable life?

#### 1. Who Are <u>Those People</u>?

...those people are people who are challenging, critical, <u>arrogant</u>, sometimes just really cranky, negative, and mean. *Those people* are <u>everywhere</u>. Dealing with *those people* is <u>nothing new</u>.

Note <u>Matthew 9:10-11</u>; <u>12:14</u>; <u>26:56b</u> Note <u>2 Timothy 1:15</u>; <u>4:9-10</u>; <u>14-16</u> Note <u>3 John v.9-10</u>

If we're Jesus followers, we know we're supposed to <u>love</u> everybody, including *those people*.

But *those people* are more difficult to love than ever before, because in our sideways world offending and being offended has become the <u>norm</u> for most people.

#### **2.** What is the Risk of not Dealing with *Those People* God's Way?

...having a <u>negative</u> impact in the lives of people who haven't said 'YES!' to Jesus as Lord...

But there's also a risk to ourselves that has <u>spiritually</u> destructive consequences (note <u>Ephesians 4:26-27</u>).

Anger undealt with opens the door, creates opportunities, installs footholds/ staircases in our lives for the devil to <u>exploit</u>. The devil uses <u>lies</u> to confuse, manipulate, and distract us from Jesus, His truth, and His mission. And <u>ultimately</u> his goal is to destroy us and our connection to God.
