They just didn't try to follow the 10 Commandments, but they developed their list of laws to follow = $\underline{613}!$ (Note Luke 18:12)

The tax collectors...were viewed by people as the <u>scum</u> of the earth. As soon as Jesus said *Pharisee* and *tax collector*, there was no doubt in anyone's mind who was *bad* and who was *good*...

They would have been <u>blown away</u> by Jesus' conclusion (note <u>Luke 18:13-14a</u>).

2. A <u>Tension</u> to Navigate

The main reason our world is so broken, and people's lives are so messy, and chaos seems to dominate everything is because God's truth has been distorted, <u>disparaged</u>, and ignored.

Note John 8:32

But because we know God's truth and what's right, sometimes we get <u>offended</u> by those who ignore/deny/attack God's truth and do/say/think what's wrong.

And if we stay offended long enough, an offense <u>simmers</u>, starts to grow, and eventually makes its home in our heart.

And it grows from offense to <u>contempt</u>.

And if we're not careful, instead of hating what someone does, we start to hate <u>who they are</u>.

When we see how wrong others can be, we fall into the <u>comparison</u> trap and forget that as human beings, we all share the same major problem = spiritually defective DNA (note <u>Romans 3:10-12, 23</u>; <u>Jeremiah 17:9</u>). And even when we are right, we might be <u>rude</u>/not loving (note <u>1 Corinthians 13:1-3</u>).
