

"Make Room"

MESSAGE NOTES

<u>No room</u> is a big part of the Christmas story (note <u>Luke 2:1-7</u>). But before pointing fingers at the innkeeper, we need to recognize we also do this (<u>individually</u> and as a society).

...why don't I make room for Jesus in my daily/personal life?

1. Our Focus is Elsewhere

One of the characteristics of God is that He is <u>omnipresent</u> (present everywhere; note Psalm 139:7-12).

Too often we're not connected/tuned in to the fact Jesus is around us.

Note <u>John 4:10</u> and <u>Luke 24:16</u>

Other things become our focus and fill the <u>inn</u> of our heart...

2. Our Heart is Overcrowded

Principle = stuff <u>accumulates</u>.

Your heart was made for God; but if you've rented out your heart to other boarders, then you won't have room or time for God...

Too many people today think that they can do their own thing and be the captain of their own <u>destiny</u>, only to discover it leads to broken lives, relationships, disappointments, and <u>emptiness</u> (note <u>1 Corinthians 2:14</u>; <u>Mark 4:19</u>; <u>Deuteronomy 8:14</u>).

3. Our Self-Sufficiency is Overrated

Actually our biggest problem as human beings is <u>pride</u> (note <u>Psalm 10:4</u>). <u>Anything</u> that pushes God out of first place in my life is an idol/false god. We need God's power to live life as God purposed for us (note <u>Isaiah 53:6</u>).

4. When I Make Room for Jesus...

- A. I get to know my <u>Creator</u> and Savior (note <u>1 John 1:1-4</u>) life is better when we live it according to the One who <u>designed</u> us. Note <u>Mathew 1:21</u> and <u>John 3:16</u>. Every person's greatest need is <u>forgiveness</u> (note <u>John 1:11-12</u>).
- B. I receive meaning, <u>peace</u>, and strength for my life you were made for more than money and <u>success</u>. You were made for meaning and <u>significance</u> (note <u>2 Corinthians 6:12-13</u>). But when we make room for Jesus, we can experience His <u>peace</u>...(note <u>John 14:27</u>). When we give more and more of the rooms of our lives to Jesus, He gives us the strength we need in every <u>circumstance</u> of life (note <u>2 Timothy 1:7</u>).
