Why baptism is a bold next step in your spiritual journey:

Baptism is not an "optional ______" for Jesus' followers. It's to be done as soon after you ______ your faith in Jesus as possible (note Acts 8:26-31, 34-39). The challenge is for you to make a ______ commitment to be baptized.

Here are the 3 qualifications to engage in baptism:

- 1) You need to be a follower of Jesus.
- 2) You need to have not been baptized as an adult believer in Christ already.
- 3) You need to be at least 12 years old

(We do baptize children younger than 12 if they have parental support and have talked it through with the Children's Pastor. Family Ministries also has a <u>discipleship class</u> for children under 12; they are given a chance to engage in baptism after completing this course; you can find details on our website).

Don't get baptized:

- \Rightarrow If you're not sure about following Jesus.
- \Rightarrow If you're trying to impress others.
- \Rightarrow If you think it would be a "cool" experience with your friends/family.

Do what Jesus calls you to do. Do it today!

WHAT DOES BAPTISM LOOK LIKE AT RIVERSIDE —

How often do you offer baptism? We generally host baptism celebrations 3-4 times/year. Some take place during the worship service in our indoor baptismal tank. We've also hosted indoor celebrations after worship services or other times. We usually have an outdoor celebration during the summer, often in a private pool.

Will you perform a private baptism? As a general rule, since baptism is defined as a <u>public</u> declaration of faith, we schedule baptisms during times where friends, family, and others can celebrate with you.

Do I need to be a member to be baptized at Riverside? No. As long as you are a follower of Jesus and have not been baptized as an adult believer in Christ already, you can participate in our baptism celebrations.

Can I request a specific pastor baptize me? Yes! If there is a pastor (or another person) who has been really key in developing your walk of faith, we encourage you to ask them to be a part of your special day!

What will I need to do? Once you've completed your MyStory and given your testimony to a pastor or Elder, we'll let you know when our next celebration is scheduled and what you can expect. We'll provide details on the service, how you will enter and exit the baptismal tank/pool, and other details to make you comfortable with your baptism. For some services, if time permits, the pastor will give each person the opportunity to answer a question about why they wish to be baptized; most times we'll just print this information in a booklet for people to share.

What should I wear? Women should wear shorts or a modest swimsuit and a top. Men may wear shorts or a modest swimsuit and a t-shirt. Bring a change of clothes, a towel, and a plastic bag for your wet clothes.

Can my family and friends be baptized together? Yes! If each person understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed his/her trust in Christ for salvation, we encourage families to be baptized at the same time. It is a wonderful expression of commitment. However, it is important to remember that baptism is a personal statement of faith, not a family or group tradition. It is usually not wise to delay your baptism while waiting on others to join you. This puts an undue pressure on them, and delays your obedience.
